Craig is regularly called on to advise business owners on appropriate business structures and strategies to achieve their goals related to the succession of businesses and the death of business owners. He has significant expertise in the use of family trusts for business succession and other purposes.

This includes educating parents on the planning required to protect ODSP benefits for their children and utilizing the legal tools to secure this protection, advocating on behalf of families when beneficiaries' ODSP benefits are at risk, and representing families where court-ordered guardianship is required to care for their loved ones. He is a director of Community Living Mississauga and sits on their Rights Review Committee.

In addition, Craig has a robust estate administration and litigation practice providing efficient, cost effective and expert advice to estate trustees in everyday probate and estate administration work.

Uniquely qualified to deal with more complex issues, he advises clients on succession of businesses, establishing and administering testamentary trusts, extra provincial and foreign jurisdictions, claims by and against estates and conflict resolution.
